The Summer School “How to do Business in South-East Europe” is a three week programme conducted in English. The programme is open to both **undergraduate (last year’s) and graduate students of business studies and economics.**



Participating students have to choose two out of three courses (altogether 12 ECTS):

1. **Economies of South-East Europe** (6 ECTS)
2. **Cross-Cultural Communication Management** with the focus on the South-East Europe (6 ECTS)
3. **Negotiations Techniques** with the focus on the South-East Europe (6 ECTS).

Each course consists of 60 hours, 30 hours in-class lectures and 30 hours of workshops, case-studies, home-readings and 2 company visits.

Students and professors will visit two successful Slovenian companies from various industries or services in different Slovenian regions. Company visits are an integral part of the programme and ECTS credits. After completing all course requirements and exams, students will receive an official transcript of records and a certificate of attendance.

Eligible co-funding for students: tuition for two courses with course material, company visits, official social activities, accommodation in double room with shared bathroom and kitchen, city bus ticket, breakfast and lunch on week-days (Monday-Friday).

Travel costs (including any costs for entry/exit visas as required) will be accounted for on the basis of the real costs incurred; maximum travel costs per students are: Belgium: 400 EUR, Poland: 500 EUR, Portugal: 600 EUR, Turkey: 600 EUR. All other costs have to be covered by students.
