Partnering with Explainable AI

Contemporary Artificial Intelligence tools offer significant potential to support people in a range of tasks and roles. However, in order for this potential to be appropriately realised we need to better understand how humans and AI work together: the capabilities of modern AI tools mean that we need to shift from viewing the AI as a passive tool to viewing it as a partner. We examined this in the context of work-based analytics through an interpretive case study interviewing 28 workers. We found that while there were indeed opportunities for the AI tool to provide useful support, there were also a number of barriers: accuracy, transparency, feedback, and configurability, as well as misalignment of categories. We argue that explainability is a crucial feature, since it supports transparency, can help ensure accuracy (or at least detect inaccuracy), and plays a role in feedback. We also argue that in some domains there is a "right to explanation" that arises as a consequence of existing human rights legislation. We then consider how the explainability of a given system can be assessed, proposing a scoresheet for doing so. Finally, we report on an evaluation of the effectiveness of explanation, showing that the link between explanation and trust can be complex and sometimes counter-intuitive.
