Universities can foster that kind of culture by exposing students to sustainable leadership in the form of teaching materials, readings, examples, role models, and experiential learning. Trends in the population show a great need for entrepreneurialism, especially in the fields of healthcare, nutrition, and mobility - due to the growing aging population. Appreciative inquiry is one of the tools we can use when starting a new journey, acknowledging past successes that can give us the courage for upcoming challenges so we are better equipped to identify our sources of strength and resilience. Social entrepreneurs are an example of community pillars that take seriously their responsibility to create positive impact in their communities and beyond.

UL SEB Commitment to UN SDGs

Inclusion of UN SDGs into UL SEB Course Deliveries

Developing ERS competencies and promotion of ERS behaviour is an important strategic direction for UL SEB, and is linked to contributions to wider community and to sustainable development. This is why, traditionally, ERS topics are also largely included in the course content of most UL SEB courses.

To get a more accurate number of how many UN SDGs were covered by UL SEB Courses, a Course Delivery Survey was launched in 2023. In the survey we mapped the 2021/2022 academic year. According to the Course Delivery Survey, the average number of UN SDGs covered in courses was 8,5 UN SDGs per course.

The top three UN SDGs included in course content are SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth, SDG 9 - Industry Innovation and Infrastructure, and SDG 12 - Responsible Consumption and Production. A total of 90,4 percent of UL SEB courses include SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth; 87,5 percent of UL SEB courses include SDG 9 - Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure; and 76,5 percent of UL SEB courses include SDG 12 - Responsible Consumption and Production.

Through the survey, keywords connected with individual SDGs were mapped. According to the results, the top 10 SDG keywords were: digitalisation, innovation, digital transformation, corporate social responsibility, COVID-19, sustainable growth, economic productivity, consumption, demographic change, and economic development.

Through the courses we teach at SEB, we aim to develop an entrepreneurial mindset in our students that helps them create new value by exploring and exploiting opportunities, while remaining resilient in uncertain conditions. At SEB, we recognise that there are two important factors that are fundamental to developing an entrepreneurial mindset. Firstly, our courses are designed to support the development of students' metacognition by giving them the opportunity to take responsibility for their own learning. 










How can postgraduate students embody entrepreneurialism and resilience to excel academically and in their future careers?
